Christians Worshipped on Sunday.

- Christians met on the "first day of the week" to break bread or observe the Lord's Supper (Acts 20:7).
- Upon the first day of the week Christians gave (1 Cor. 16:1-2).
- It was on the "first day of the week" that Jesus was resurrected from the dead (Mt 28:1).

The New Testament Never Refers to Sunday as the Christian Sabbath.

The Bible refers to Sunday as "the first day of the week." The apostle John was in the Spirit on the "Lord's Day" (Rev. 1:10) which may have been Sunday. Sunday is never referred as the Sabbath Day.

Christians are not told to keep the Sabbath Holy.

Christians are not to observe all the special things that went along with the Sabbath. Christians may cook, travel or even shop on the Sabbath day. Christians do not face the penalties for violating the Sabbath. Sunday does not have any restrictions except to worship the Lord with other saints. It is not wrong to do other things on Sunday. The Sabbath does not have the special meaning for many Christians that it did for the nation of Israel. Keeping the Sabbath has no significance for a Christian.
